Christmas in Two Sentences

The message of Christmas can be described by two <u>simple</u> sentences that are, for many people, <u>difficult</u> to accept.

- 1. God became man! (God's action)
 - When Jesus was born, He did not <u>start</u> existing then, but He had existed <u>forever</u> as the Lord God. (Isaiah 6:1, John 12:37-41)
 - When Jesus was born, He simply took on <u>human</u> form.
 - Jesus became human so that He could <u>die</u> in our place. (Phil 2:7-8)
 - Jesus died to save us from our <u>sin</u>!
- 2. We worship Him! (Our response)
 - The moment Jesus is born, His journey to the **<u>cross</u>** begins (This Child will grow up and eventually die for me!).
 - Understanding what God has done, our appropriate <u>response</u> is to <u>worship</u>
 Him! (Matthew 2:11, Phil 2:9-11)
 - The song "Thou Didst Leave Thy Throne" portrays one way of responding: "O come to my heart, Lord Jesus, there is room in my heart for [You]."
