"Come Let us Worship"

(Psalm 95:6-7a, NIV)

What if my life is a mess right now, and I simply cannot sing to God?

Q: Who wrote Psalm 95?

A: King David.

→ In Hebrews 4:7 where the writer quotes Psalm 95, David is said to be the one who wrote the Psalm.

Exploration of David's life

- David's life was **not always full of singing and rejoicing**; he had lots of **suffering**.
- David would constantly cry out to God (Ex. Ps 6:2-3, Ps 13:1-2, 55:1-2 etc.).
- But whenever David was suffering and even complaining to the Lord, David still **trusted in Him** at the end (Ex Ps 6:8-9, Ps 13:5-6, Ps 55:16-17 etc.).
- David acknowledged who God is and what He can do.
 - → One form of worship
- Even <u>in the midst of unbearable sorrow</u>, such as the loss of his son, David still <u>worshiped</u> God (2 Sam. 12:19-20).
 - → Worship is not just singing and rejoicing, but is also the act of <u>acknowledging</u> that God is God and praising Him for who He is.
