"Do you know what to do?"

(2 Chronicles 20 (NIV))

Q: Do we always know what to do in any circumstance? Especially when facing battles in life?

- I. Did King Jehoshaphat know what to do?
 - A great enemy was about to attack Jehoshaphat. (v.1-2)
 - He said "We <u>do not know what to do</u>." (v.12)
 - Then he continued on to say "but our eyes are on you"! (v.12)
 - He knew exactly what to do! \rightarrow Turn to the Lord for help!
 - King Jehoshaphat did not know what to do **except** to turn his attention to the Lord.
 - When you have more than one option, prayer is the best option! When prayer is your only option, it is the best option anyway!

II. Conclusion

 \rightarrow We always know at least one thing we can do; <u>turn to the Lord</u>.

III. God's response

- "Do not be afraid or discouraged because of this vast army. For the battle is not yours, but God's" (v.15)
- "Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged. Go out to face them tomorrow, and **the LORD will be with you**." (v.17)
- Then, God brought victory to Judah.
