# "How much is knowing Jesus worth?" (Philippians 3:7-8)

#### **Knowing Jesus**

- According to the Bible, to become a Christian means to "*know*" Jesus Christ.
- Knowing someone ≠ Knowing about someone
- In the Bible, knowing someone means to have a close, personal *relationship*.

#### Review of 9/28/14 message:

- Knowing Jesus is <u>not</u> the most important thing in life.
- Knowing Jesus <u>is</u> life.
- "Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent." (John 17:3, NIV)

## **Value of knowing Jesus**

- "More than that, I count <u>all things to be loss</u> in view of the surpassing value of <u>knowing Christ Jesus</u> my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and <u>count them but rubbish</u> so that I may gain Christ [...]" (Philippians 3:8, NASB)
- Compared to knowing Jesus, *all things* are *rubbish*.
- <u>All things</u> means <u>all</u> things.
- <u>Rubbish</u> means things despised and not worthy of even considering.

## **Background of the letter to the Philippians**

- In Philippi, Paul had been beaten and imprisoned for "knowing Jesus" and living for Him. (Acts 16:23-24)
- When Paul was writing this letter to the Philippians, he was in prison in Rome, for "knowing Jesus"!
- Paul still gladly said "knowing Jesus Christ is everything to me"!
